The following information has been provided by Kinga Krider, West Peoria City Administrator. If you have any question regarding these topics or any other concerns, please contact City Hall, (309) 674-1993.

KEEPING OUR CITY CLEAN - A friendly reminder with Spring comes an abundance of new growth. Please be sure grass and weeds are kept mowed or trimmed and out of the street, especially between the curb and sidewalk, as well as the alley line and behind fences and garages. Any vegetation over 9" high violates the City Code.

YARD WASTE PICK-UP - With Spring comes yard work! Yard waste pick up begins Friday, April 5th and will continue each Friday through December 27, 2024.

PET CARE - Please remember to be courteous to your neighbors. With warmer weather, be sure to clean up all animal wastes on your property within 24 hours. Also, if you are walking your pets, please be sure to keep your pets on a leash and pick up their feces. For the safety of all involved, animals must be on leashes whenever they are off your property or on leads if they are outside and not in an enclosed areas.

PERMITS - Spring is a great time to tackle all those outdoor home improvement projects that have been on hold for the winter. Want to replace or put up a new fence? Planning a new outdoor patio/deck? Time to repair that sidewalk or drive-way? Get the kids that swimming pool? Put up a shed? Call or stop by City Hall, or visit the City website for the proper paperwork for permit completion.

GRANTS - Many people have been asking about the grant programs the City has traditionally offered. If approved by the City Council at its April 23rd meeting, the City will again offer the following grants effective **MAY 1ST**.

- Residential Redevelopment Grant (RDG) Program - outside improvement; sorry, fences are not included.
- TIF Grant outside improvement for people in the TIF district. Residents should receive a postcard in the mail.
- Security Grant security cameras with recording capabilities
- Paint Program outside paint improvement

Applications will be available on our website and at City Hall beginning Monday, May 1st. The grants are available on a **first-come**, **first-served basis until the funds are depleted**. **Please note multiple changes have been implemented this year. Be sure to read the applications thoroughly!**

Many have survived in West Peoria for over a hundred years. The Chinguapin oak in St. Mary's Cemetery may be 200 years old, massive and sheltered on your left as you drop down between the two cemetery levels.

On Saturday, May 11th, from 10:00 a.m.- 2:00 p.m., the fifth annual "Native Plant Sale" will be held outside Haddad's on Rohmann. There will be over 60 different species of locally grown native plants for sale. This is the primary fundraiser for Friends of Rocky Glen. We hope you will stop by to visit our sale!


Hope your Spring is off to a good start!






RUGBY IN WEST PEORIA
