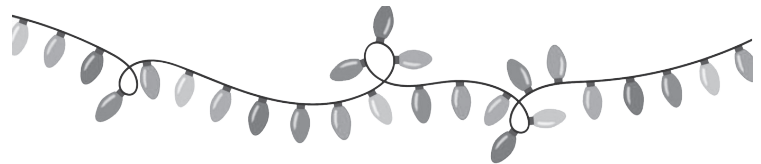

CONSTRUCTION CONTINUES FOR NEW CITY HALL



The new West Peoria City Hall, under construction at the corner of Rohman and Sterling, will serve as the hub of governance, administration, and community engagement for generations to come. This signifies a new chapter in the history of West Peoria, showcasing the city's commitment to progress and development.

SNOWFALL

With the arrival of winter weather, we wanted to remind everyone that all streets in West Peoria are considered snow routes. When there is a forecast of 2 or more inches of snow, make sure to move all vehicles off the streets. Stay informed about local forecasts. For alerts, check the City website: www.cityofwestpeoria.org. If you don't have a driveway, or space in your yard, ask a neighbor for help in clearing a space for your vehicle until the streets are plowed. Remember, any vehicles that are obstructing snow removal may be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.

WASTE MANAGEMENT PICKUP

Kindly ensure that your trash containers are ready for collection by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled pickup day. All waste should be properly disposed of inside the toter with the lid closed. For large items or if you require an extra cart, reach out to Waste Management directly.

HOLIDAY HOURS

Please note: City Hall will be closed on Tuesday, December 24th and Wednesday, December 25th for Christmas, and Wednesday, January 1st for New Year's Day.

POSTAL DROPBOX RELOCATION

With the construction of the new City Hall at the corner of Rohman and Sterling, the US Postal Service drop box will be relocated. In the near future, the dropbox will be moved to Rohman Avenue, between City Hall and Had-dad's.

THE NEED FOR TREES IN A COMMUNITY

Trees are enormously beneficial to communities. Consider these tree facts from the Morton Arboretum in Lisle, Illinois:

- Trees contribute to reducing urban temperatures
- Trees provide infrastructure to support rainwater management by soaking and filtering rainwater through their roots and catching rain water on their leaves, which then evaporates. According to the US Forest Service, 100 mature trees intercept about 250,000 gallons of rainwater annually.
- Nationwide, trees provide about \$18.3 billion in annual value by removing air pollution and reducing building energy use.
- The return on investment for trees is huge -- every dollar a community spends on planting and caring for trees returns up to 500% in property values and reduced energy costs.
- Trees increase home values. Neighborhoods with mature trees have home values about 10% higher than neighborhoods with fewer mature trees. On average, each front yard tree adds 1% to a home's sale price, and large trees can add as much as 10% to a home's value.
- Trees are good for mental health. The sight of trees reduces blood pressure and helps people be more productive. Exposure to trees and nature reduces children's stress. Treelined roadways help drivers relax. Hospital patients with views of trees recover more quickly, have lower blood pressure and experience less stress.



HORSESHOE BOTTOMS

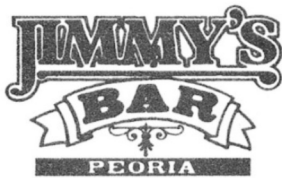
